FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Wave Academy has continued to grow every year since our founding, and I'm thrilled to report 2014 was the best to date.

After two years of data collection, and in partnership with Johns Hopkins' Center for Research and Reform in Education Institute, we have documented new evidence that Warm Water Aquatic Bodywork Therapy (ABT) helps reduce Post Traumatic Stress (PTS) symptoms over an eight-week treatment period. Please see the evaluation study results below for more details.

Additionally, Wave Academy saw contributions increase by 101% from the previous year. Included in this was an \$82,500 restricted grant award, the largest since our inception.

With the support of our community, practitioners, leadership and donors we continue to transform the lives of our veterans, their family members and caregivers.

Selected Accomplishments:

- Finalized and released study performed in partnership with Johns Hopkins University
- Increased client sessions by 370% compared to 2013
- Expanded to four private pools to offer our services on an ongoing basis
- Increased total funding by 101% over 2013

OUR MISSION

POST TRAUMATIC STRESS by the numbers

Of the more than 2.6 million service men and women who served in Iraq and Afghanistan, the National Veterans Association reports that 20-35 percent returned home with PTS. Approximately 1,000 veterans of these wars are diagnosed with PTS every week. There are tens of thousands of families struggling with the devastating effects of PTS – evidenced by the alarming statistic that 22 veterans commit suicide every day in the U.S.

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YOUR SUPPORT IN ACTION

Johns Hopkins Study

Wave Academy partnered with the renowned Center for Research and Reform in Education Institute at Johns Hopkins University to learn more about the impact of ABT for treating PTS.

Once per week for eight weeks 15 PTS diagnosed veterans participated in individual one-hour ABT sessions.

The study found that participants experienced a more than 28% decrease in PTS symptoms, resulting in improved sleep duration and quality, decreased pain and lower levels of anxiety.

FINDINGS:

- Preliminary results indicate that warm water therapy may be linked to better sleep, pain reduction and lower levels of anxiety.
- The PTSD Checklist Military (PCL-M) scores showed a 28% median reduction in symptoms over the protocol.
- The Profile of Mood States (POMS) scores showed a 38% median reduction in symptoms over the protocol.

Among others, these findings confirm the viability of ABT and set the stage for increasing care, building awareness, and improving the quality of life for our veterans. To view the full report, visit www.WaveAcademy.com/resources



Year after year Wave Academy continues to expand. In 2013 and 2014 we focused on building the organization with qualified practitioners, outreach to the military community and launching and finalizing the Johns Hopkins University study.

Always with an eye on the future and heart set on transforming the lives of our Iraq and Afghanistan veterans, in 2015 we have set our sights on even greater growth - expanding client Aquatic Bodywork Therapy sessions to 1,100 and increasing client enrollment by 115 new clients.

To achieve this, we're broadening our reach within the military community through organizational partnerships, increasing funding through donors and grants, training more practitioners and securing pools that meet the demands of this life changing work.
