Dear Friends of Healing Wave Aquatics,

As a client was getting ready to leave, she stepped into my office. "For the first time I can feel my mind connected to my body," she said. Her words echoed what many clients feel at HWA. It's a privilege to share our 2024 Annual Report with you.

Highlights from 2024:

- HWA achieved **evidence-based research** about the efficacy of our aquatic therapy program as a valid treatment option for reducing PTSD symptoms and supporting mental health.
- 125 program clients gained mental health support through aquatic therapy with an average **decrease in PTS symptoms of 23%** between their first and last sessions.

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- Two new staff positions created to better support clients: Behavioral Health Specialist and Client Care Coordinator.
- Two new board members: Carlos Danny Carreón, US Navy-Retired with master's degree in Organizational Leadership, and Rob Green, Executive Operations Leadership
- HWA was in the Media:
 - "It's Wellness Time" Podcast of the Southern Indian Health Council
 - "Peaceful Waters," article about HWA published by San Diego Health & Human Services in all County newspapers on Veterans Day 2024.
- Funding partnerships with Midway Foundation, Cushman Foundation, San Diego County D3, Naval Officers & Spouses Club, and our community of donors with 30 new donors in 2024.

RESEARCH

It's Scientific: Research Shows Efficacy of HWA Program in Decreasing Symptoms of Post-Traumatic Stress

A 2024 research study of our program was conducted by Dr. Thomas Rutledge, PhD, ABPP, Staff Psychologist at the VA San Diego Healthcare System and Professor of Psychiatry at UC San Diego. The research was published in the journal, Stress & Health in April 2025.

The retrospective report provides the first quantitative assessment of a novel, non-exposure-based behavioural treatment called traumalinformed aquatic therapy in a military population with established PTSD. The study assessed 111 participants of HWA.

Researchers found, "in this clinical sample of activeIduty and military veterans participating in up to eight weekly sessions of treatment, we observed statistically and clinically significant reductions in PTSD symptoms." They also found:

- Treatment participation was very high overall.
- There was a high level of external validity with a broad sample of active-duty and military veterans referred by a community provider or self-seeking treatment.
- Participant satisfaction levels were also rated highly, with a mean average rating of 4.9/5.

You can say – based on your data – not only that your veterans get meaningful improvements in their PTSD symptoms, on average, but actually enjoy the process of getting better. Your satisfaction numbers might be higher than I've ever seen for a PTSD treatment! — Dr. Rutledge


VISION

TRAUMA-INFORMED APPROACH

Healing Wave Aquatics is committed to providing a safe and healing environment. We do this by adopting best practices for a trauma-sensitive approach to working with clients.

What does trauma-informed aquatic therapy at HWA look like?

Training and Experience

- Staff and practitioners participate in regular training and discussions.
- Our Behavioral Health Specialist holds a master's degree in mental health counseling and conducts an assessment of various physical and mental trauma, including life-changing events, such as gender transition or survival of suicide attempt.
- Our Aquatic Therapists have all achieved a high level of practice with a minimum of 1,000 hours of training, including: 500 hours of specialized aquatic therapy training, 500 hours of massage therapy training, classes in trauma-informed care specifically for clients with PTS and suicidal ideation, as well as CPR/Life Support certification.

Client Agency

- We explain the process with the client, getting approval, offering opportunities to make changes.
- We make space for communication (even if non-verbal) to give the client agency in making choices about their comfort.

Pacing

- We offer a pace in harmony with the breath.
- We take our time, going slowly, and even taking breaks if needed.
- We provide exit strategies for any challenges that may arise.
- We provide stable support to allow the client's mind to navigate potentially challenging moments because of traumatic memory.
- We ensure time to bring a session to a close gracefully.

Process of Feedback, Layering, and Retention

- We use weekly feedback forms to ensure quality of care and adapt to changes.
- Successive sessions allow for individualized care that's in harmony with a client's needs.

Recognition and Celebration

- We affirm a client's progress through each session
- Upon completion of the program, we celebrate with a graduation packet that includes a certificate, a challenge coin, a t-shirt and additional resources for support.


